Have you ever thought of playing volleyball on a sand court at the beach? To many people, playing beach volleyball is indeed a good way to exercise and spend their leisure time in summer. Since 2014, the Hong Kong Schools Sports Federation (HKSSF) has organized yearly inter-school beach volleyball competitions, which have provided local secondary students with opportunities to participate in professional matches of this interesting sport. Recently, beach volleyball has become a thriving sport in Hong Kong among teenagers.

#### The history and rules of beach volleyball

Beach volleyball originated in Santa Monica, California in 1915. Being an inexpensive sport, beach volleyball gained popularity in the United States and Europe in the 1930s. It has been an Olympic sport since the 1996 Summer Olympics. The sport is particularly popular in Brazil today.

The rules of beach volleyball are very similar to those of indoor volleyball. However, there are still some differences between them. For instance, beach volleyball is played on a smaller sand court without a centre line. A beach volleyball team only has two players. Interestingly, the players cannot be substituted, but they can use any part of the body to hit the ball during the game. Besides, they do not have fixed positions, which means they can play in any position on the court. The team which gets 21 points with 2 points ahead wins a set. The first team which wins two sets wins the match.



### Professional development of beach volleyball

At first, the sport was played as a leisure activity. With its increase in popularity and the athletes' awareness of the need for professional development of the sport, some professional beach volleyball tournaments were organized in the 1970s. Today, the Fédération Internationale de Volleyball (English: International Volleyball Federation, FIVB) is the most world-renowned organization which plans and organizes continental volleyball events, including the Olympic Games and World Championships for all forms of volleyball. As for beach volleyball, the FIVB Beach World Championships and the FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour are regarded as the two most internationally recognized events.




#### Beach volleyball in Hong Kong

Hong Kong has its own advantages of developing beach volleyball. There are over 40 well-managed beaches distributed in different districts in Hong Kong, with seven of them got a volleyball court built in. More and more people in Hong Kong have become interested in beach volleyball because it is inexpensive to play. Its association with a light-hearted, beach-centric lifestyle attracts many people to give it a try during hot summer months. Apart from the game itself, the fashion related to the sport is also appealing to players. It is not just a sport, but an activity for people to socialize and enjoy a great party time at the beach!

Do you want to fully utilize your summer holiday to do something other than swimming, diving or barbeques? You should try beach volleyball with your friends and have great fun together!





The first question we asked was if students liked the volleyball court. The result shows that most students across all forms enjoy using the volleyball court. They think that the volleyball court gives them a new choice to exercise and they have so much fun when they are playing volleyball there. Some Secondary 1, 2, and 5 students think that the court is well-equipped as they do not need to set up the net to use it. When they get there, game is on! However, some Secondary 1 students, about 30% of our pool, said that they did not like the volleyball court and some said that they preferred playing sports indoors than outdoors.

Then, we asked 10 students from different forms to see if they were satisfied with the size of the volleyball court. The result shows that most students at TTCA were satisfied with it, especially the Secondary 2 students. However, some Secondary 3 students think that the school may consider building another volleyball court. They said they could rarely use it as it is always occupied.

When asked what kind of improvement the school could consider, some students suggested that the school could provide volleyballs for them to borrow. Since some students don't usually bring their own volleyballs, it will be more convenient if they can borrow it from the school. Some also suggested setting up rules for the volleyball court so that the students who use it do not abuse it.

To sum up, most of our students are ecstatic that a volleyball court has been built. Most students are very excited that they finally get a chance to play their favourite sport on the campus.




#### 勝過自己 更強於勝過別人






to the new environment guickly.
