What springs to mind when you think of school teams? Definitely sports teams, am I right? School teams take a huge part in promoting activities, encouraging students to learn something new, and representing the school in inter-school competitions. Most people enjoy watching sports because it's entertaining, but let's not neglect the academic teams. If you think they are just about long and dull talks about some uninteresting topics, well, I'm going to prove you wrong. The activities in the academic clubs can be stimulating. Students interact with one another to discuss the topics and come up with a consensus. This experience can be very useful in our future daily lives. In this article, you will read about the first-hand experiences of school mate from the English Debate Team (EDT), Chinese Debate Team (CDT) and Mathematics Team (MT).

#### *English Debate Team*

I believe most of the students in TTCA have no problem communicating in English, but what does it take to become a member of the EDT? I interviewed Anson, a former member of the team. Anson was a shy kid way back in his primary school years. But after he came to TTCA, he wanted to learn how to express his ideas more accurately, and that's why he embarked on this new journey with the EDT to improve his thinking and speaking skills. During their training, students would brainstorm ideas on a topic provided by the teachers. After that they would practice by exchanging ideas and engaging in conversations. This allows them to perfect their speech and get used to thinking on their feet for rebuttals. Although Anson has only participated in two competitions due to the pandemic, those short but meaningful events gave him a life-changing experience, for it sharpened his critical thinking skills and boosted his confidence in expressing his ideas to a large audience. Anson said he strongly recommended junior form students join EDT, since participating in debates gives students a wider perspective on politics and philosophy, and hence the world around them. Students gain a better appreciation for the diverse perspectives that make up the public sphere.





## / Chinese Debate Team /

Personally, I detest Chinese, but after interviewing a member of the Chinese Debate Team, Gabriel, I changed my mind. Gabriel had wanted to learn more about debating since primary school, so he joined the CDT in secondary school. Another reason, was because he had trouble with Chinese-related subjects in exams. He saw it as a chance for him to learn and improve. During training sessions, members have the opportunity to practise their communication skills and also, learn how to write a debate script. They take part in competitions every semester. Such a schedule gives students ample time to prepare, as they also have to face their daily challenges of school every day. As for the teachers there, they are all highly experienced. Team members get advice from them by listening to their past stories. Gabriel is delighted about being part of the CDT as he is trained to think critically. These skills can be applied to his learning process, get him better grades, and create synergy between him and his team mates.

## / Mathematics Team /

Oh maths, maths, maths. Who on earth would love such a harsh subject? Not me, definitely. My brain can't process too many numbers at a time. Yet, as a member of the MT, Benjamin, would say otherwise. His story of joining the MT started when he competed in the Mathematical Olympiad during his primary school years. At that time, he didn't really like maths, but he got encouraged by his mother to give it a try. As it turned out, he enjoyed maths. So what does the MT do during practice? Students are given different types of questions from previous MT competitions, then they brainstorm on the approach of how to solve them. After they are done, the teachers explain the solution and point out things they should be aware of. What I'm most curious about is the difference between the maths questions students do during their normal maths lessons and those done during MT training. Well, the answer was simpler than I expected — students get to try out questions that are slightly more advanced than their level. So if you're an S.1 student, you'll be doing S.2 or S.3 maths. When asked whether he finds mathematics a difficult subject, he replied no without hesitation. "It's probably because I put more time into learning maths than others." He also added doing math has given him a problem-solving mindset. "For the harder questions we encounter, we only need to use different perspectives to observe them. It might be unsolvable for some people. Why? It's because they only attempt to solve the questions once. If they fail to do so, they give up. What I'm saying is that thinking in a different way and trying a few more times with a different method is the right way to do it. It's like a puzzle, you have to solve it step by step. This also tests your persistence." Benjamin expressed his pride to be part of the MT during my interview with him. Since he gets to learn maths that is more advanced, he enjoys helping out his friends when it's their turn to learn. He recommended schoolmates who are interested in maths to join the team, no matter if they're good at maths or not. Simply take it as an opportunity to learn more. Another quote from him, "I would say learning maths is not only helpful in your studies, it also teaches you how to face challenges and think outside the box in real life."

After interviewing my classmates, we can see that these teams provide different opportunities for students to learn and gain experiences, which potentially enable them to overcome challenges they have to face as they grow older. Joining the teams can be a turning point where you try something new or find joy in doing what you don't usually like. It can be the sprinkles on a cake. Don't just go to school, stick to the normal learning routine and call it a day! Try joining these teams to make your school lives more exciting!

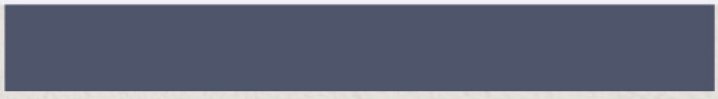

老師： 我 校 排 球 隊 在 2019 年 成 立 ， 有 幾 年 歷 史 。

記者： 組 織 排 球 隊 順 利 嗎 ？

老師： 以 男 排 為 例 ， 組 織 過 程 是 順 利 的 ， 因 男 生 上 體 育 課 時 ， 我 會 觀 察 他 們 的 表 現 ， 發 掘 他 們 的 潛 能 ， 故 不 難 找 到 有 潛 能 、 興 趣 打 排 球 的 學 生 參 加 。

記者： 在 疫 情 下 ， 排 球 隊 訓 練 有 沒 有 受 影 響 ？

老師： 男 子 排 球 隊 較 注 重 體 能 練 習 ， 球 隊 的 後 援 充 足 ， 現 以 累 積 比 賽 經 驗 為 目 標 。 而 女 子 排 球 隊 需 繼 續 提 升 隊 員 對 打 排 球 的 興 趣 ， 主 要 以 維 繫 隊 友 及 建 立 凝 聚 力 為 目 標 。

記者： 對 球 隊 有 何 期 望 ？

老師： 希 望 往 後 在 學 界 比 賽 能 獲 得 獎 牌 （ 前 四 名 ） 。 希 望 球 員 們 能 虛 心 ， 不 要 輕 易 自 滿 ， 要 勤 加 練 習 ， 珍 惜 與 人 切 磋 球 技 的 機 會 和 比 賽 所 得 的 經 驗 。

MIRROR, BTS, .... Have you heard of these groups? We know a lot of you listen to music when you are studying. What are the trends in music these days? And what are the tracks that capture the hearts of our school mates? We have the answers here!

What exactly is music? Music is actually vocal or instrumental sounds (or both) combined in such a way as to produce beauty of form, harmony, and expression of emotion. Hmm... how about some fun facts?

The average length of a song in 2019 was 3 minutes and 42 seconds, that's nearly a minute shorter than in 1995. With advertising revenue on streaming services accounting for a big portion of music profits, songs have been getting shorter in recent years, The Verge reported.

Musicians add 40,000 tracks to Spotify every day. Spotify CEO Daniel Ek said in 2019 that users add around 40,000 new songs to the streaming music platform every day. The huge volume of music can make it difficult for tracks from relatively unknown artists to get noticed by listeners.

Holiday music on the radio has growing appeal. The number of people who tune into radio stations for holiday music continues to break records. Holiday music captured 14.3% of the adult contemporary music audience share in 2018, up from 13.9% in 2017, Nielsen has reported.

## Cantopop

In case you don't know, Cantopop is a genre of pop music and music written in standard Chinese and sung in Cantonese. In the 1980s golden era, people from around the world loved Cantonese songs! These songs feature foreign and traditional tunes and new Cantonese lyrics. The genre appeared in the 1970s and became associated with Hong Kong popular music. Cantopop reached its height of popularity in the 1980s and 1990s, before favours over it slowly declined in the 2000s and then it experienced a slight revival in the 2010s. Some top Cantonese songs as of December 2021 are "12" by MIRROR, 「記憶棉」 and 「時候不早」 by Michael Cheung Tin-fu, "I know" by Keung To (ft. AGA), 「E先生連環不幸事件」 by Edan Lui, 「一表人才」 by Edan Lui, Feng Ze, 「聖誕很忙」 by Michael Cheung Tin-fu, Hung Ka Ho, "Dear my friend" by Keung To, and 「在空中的這1秒」 by Terence Lam.

## K-pop

The first runner-up in our charts is K-pop. What is K-pop? K-pop, short for Korean popular music, is a genre of music originating in South Korea. It is influenced by styles and genres from around the world, such as pop, rock, jazz, R&B, electronic dance and classical on top of its traditional Korean music roots. Why do people like K-pop so much? Pop music would be nothing without catchy hooks and sing-along lyrics. K-pop is no different. It has melodies that instantly stick in your head. Boy and girl groups alike have appealing song writing down to a science, which makes their music appealing to fans no matter what language they speak. The top K-pop songs of 2021 are "Money" and "LALISA" by Lisa from Blackpink, "Butter" by BTS, "House Party" by Super Junior, "Don't Call Me" by SHINee, "What Type of X" and "Coldblooded" by Jessi, "Rollin" by Brave Girls, "Alcohol Free" by Twice, "I'm Not Cool" by HyunA, "Bicycle" by Chungha and "Next Level" by Aespa.

## English pop songs

English pop songs came in third in the TTCA Music Chart. Pop music appeared in the U.S. and the U.K. during the 1950s. Apart from pop music, rock and roll was famous among youngsters back then. Popular music then became associated with music that was more commercial, and available later in the late 1960s. But why did some TTCiAns choose English pop as their favourite type of music?

Referring to the statistics we collected from the TTCA students, some say that it's because English is a language that they speak and so they can understand the meaning behind the songs by listening to the lyrics. Also, the lyrics are thought-provoking and easy to memorise. One of the top English pop songs in 2021 is "Levitating (ft. DaBaby) by Dua Lipa. It is the No. 1 Billboard Hot 100 Songs of the Year, following its record-breaking run on the weekly ranking, which blends streaming, radio airplay and sales data! ## INSPIRATIONAL CONTENT CREATORS

Have you ever had some free time and you looked for videos, but ended up wasting a whole 10 minutes on choosing what to watch? Among content creators in different fields, not a lot of them are actually inspirational. We have some suggestions on compelling yet inspirational content creators to make your leisure time worthwhile while keeping yourself entertained.

### CONTENT CREATORS

To start off, you might have heard of this content creator. He is one of the most popular and successful content creators out there. He is none other than MrBeast. MrBeast is an American YouTuber with over 84 million subscribers. His content varies from doing extreme challenges to donating huge amounts of money from a combination of YouTube royalties, sponsorship payments, and merchandise profits to charities. He initiated movements such as #teamtrees and #teamseas to plant more trees for the environment and to conserve seas from pollutants, and even opened his very own charity called "Beast Philanthropy" to help as many people in need as possible. Besides doing charity work, he also likes giving away money to his subscribers by having them compete in different challenges. For example, in one of his most costly videos, "Last To Leave Circle Wins \$500,000", he gathered 100 of his subscribers to compete for \$500,000 simply by not leaving the circle. Currently, the most successful video he has put out is "\$450,000 Squid Game In Real Life!", which has over 160 million views in a span of a week! That's insanely incredible! Overall, MrBeast is an entertaining yet worth-watching content creator who may inspire you to be as successful as him, as not only does he do giveaways, but also charity work. Who would have thought a then 13-year-old would be this successful?

Another influencer we would like to mention is TheGameTheorists. This personality is not like any other ordinary content creator. TheGameTheorists is an American YouTuber who comments on topics such as logic, scientific accuracy, and the lore of various video games with his own theories and predicts how the games progress. He finds clues to piece together a timeline and narrates the story by filling in the gaps. The mastermind behind all of this is none other than MatPat. One of his most known series is the "Five Nights At Freddy's" series. In the game, the player assumes the first person role and works as a nightshifter at a factory, and when midnight comes, animatronics come to life and try to kill you. The goal is to survive all 7 nights without dying once. The game was so popular because people were so intrigued by such little background information that the writer of the game gave. MatPat found it interesting so he decided to make theories about the game. It caught people's attention. Overall, TheGameTheorists is an exceptional and thought-provoking content creator, since he does theories of different varieties of games. Are you a video game lover? If so, you should definitely check out his videos!

Have you ever heard of Wilbur Soot? Wilbur Soot is a British Twitch streamer, YouTuber and musician who originated from the YouTube channel "SootHouse", where he reacts to mostly Reddit posts with a group of his friends. The channel stopped posting in 2019 due to unexplained circumstances. But, what most people don't know about Wilbur is that he actually created an ARG in 2018. That's right, when this Twitch streamer isn't writing songs about his past life experiences or social issues, he spends his free time writing a whole entire story depicting various individual stereotypes.





## WHAT IS AN ARG?

An ARG is an interactive networked narrative that uses the real world as a platform and employs transmedia storytelling to deliver a story that may be altered by players' ideas or actions, and it stands for Alternate Reality Game. The author of an ARG makes clues in real life in order to tell a story, and the "players" move locations in real life to find those clues. This is how they proceed forwards in the story. The lore of any ARG is based on the interpretation of the audience.

## WILBUR SOOT ARG

The Wilbur Soot ARG first started at popular YouTuber JackSucksAtLife's YouTube channel, where Wilbur sent Jack an email about wanting to be the editor for him. # TOKYO, JAPAN: CULTURE WITH AESTHETIC

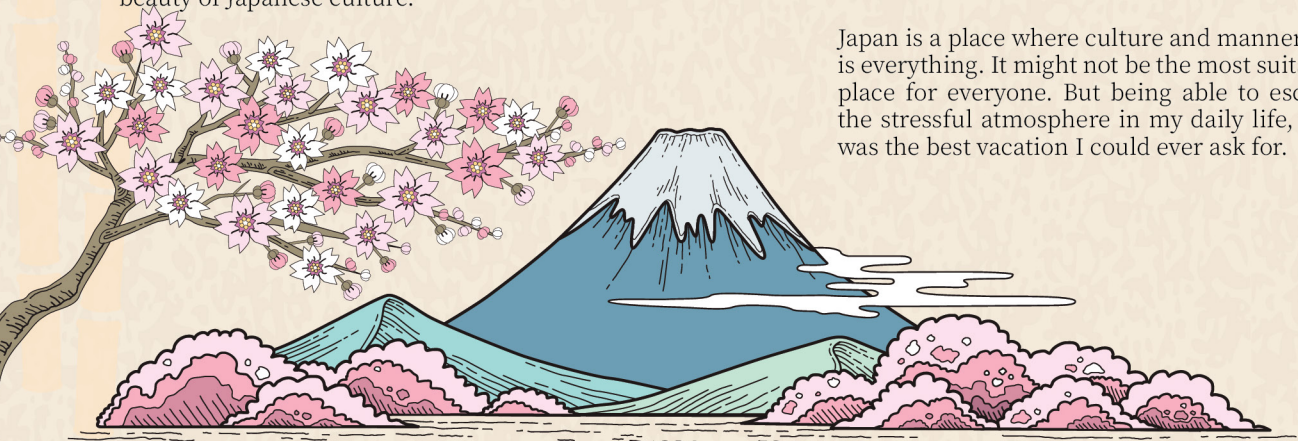

「下一站：荔枝角站！」螢幕板的顯示，將我拉回現實。

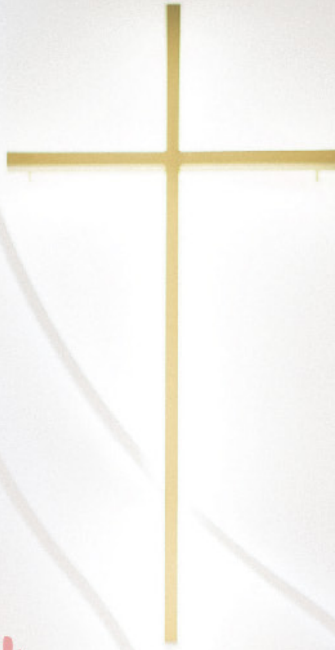
