#### What brought you to TTCA?

Although I have reached the age of retirement, I am still very healthy and I had not been the principal of a Direct Subsidy Scheme (DSS) school before. Working in this school has fewer boundaries than in government or aided schools. TTCA gives me more freedom to set school policies. With fewer overwhelming restrictions and more flexibility in TTCA, I can contribute more to the school as the principal. Therefore, I am interested in being a principal in this school.

# Why did you take Chinese History as your major at university?

When I was a secondary three student, I had excellent performance in Chinese History. After I selected Chinese History as an elective subject in secondary four, I became more enthusiastic about the subject. I always enjoyed studying Chinese History as it let me learn from lessons and wisdom from the ancients as well as learn about Chinese culture. Although I was capable of entering the final interview offered by the Faculty of Social Science of the University of Hong Kong, I forwent the chance and chose to study Chinese History instead.

#### What do you think about using Putonghua to teach Chinese?

Some people think that using Putonghua to teach Chinese can make students' Chinese language proficiency improved. They also think that it can strengthen students' proficiency in speaking Putonghua. But recently, some findings have pointed out that there is not any help to the improvement of students' Chinese ability by using Putonghua as the medium of instruction. I reckon that there are two factors which contribute to students' language proficiency. I think it highly depends on the language ability of teachers. It is certain that our language teachers have a very strong background in this area. Strengthening students' capability of speaking Putonghua is beneficial to them. However, the effect of using Putonghua to teach Chinese in Hong Kong doesn't seem to be obvious. I think the core question is whether they use Putonghua as their mother tongue or not.



#### Do you think there is too much homework to TTCA students?

I wonder how our students think about it. I promise that I will conduct a survey to collect opinions of every student. I might ask teachers to adjust the quantity of assignments according to the result of the survey.



I think our junior form students are lovely, adorable and proactive teenagers. They always answer questions in lessons. I also think that some senior form students are presentable student leaders. I expect TTCiAns to be more self-disciplined, and to treasure and understand our rights and responsibilities at school, especially the senior form students. Last but not least, students should improve their time management. They should cherish the time of learning, as we can never turn back time.

#### Our school year theme is 'Be the Best Version of Myself'. Can you give suggestions to TTCiAns about how to be the best version of themselves?

I think that TTCiAns need to work hard, recognize their duties and do their best. I want to encourage students to make their best endeavors. As everyone has his or her own strengths and weaknesses, we should strive for our best no matter it is for learning or other extra-curricular activities.




### 4E Rain Kwok




### 6A Michelle Chong



The problem of climate change is extremely alarming and is still intensifying. Despite the fact that climate change is becoming more and more serious, we know that this problem can totally be prevented.

China is a gigantic country. She has a population of over 1.3 billion and she is one of the World's oldest civilizations. Climate change is a global problem, with China being one of its victims. The seriousness of climate change has brought negative impacts to China, for instance, there is an increase in the average temperature of 0.24 degree from 1951 to 2017, an increase in the average precipitation of 1.8% and a rise in the sea level of 3.3mm /year from 1980 to 2017 etc. These are only tips of the iceberg. These impacts have greatly affected citizens' livelihoods and their quality of life. We should undoubtedly act now to prevent this problem from snowballing.

As the problem of climate change is still intensifying, China's leaders have set guidelines to monitor the situation. For instance, there is "The Guide to Chinese Climate Policy". Through this guide, Chinese climate change policies are examined and the impacts of climate change are explored. Besides setting guidelines and policies, China's leaders have also declared that climate change poses a huge challenge to the survival and development of the human race and China is one of the most vulnerable countries to the adverse impacts. Short-term and medium-term measures for limiting emissions have been adopted. This shows that China is highly concerned.

Think Local, Act Global. Apart from setting goals, the Chinese government has also adopted a five-year plan. It is for national, economic and social development and it mainly emphasizes the control of greenhouse gases. Besides solving this problem locally, China has participated in conventions and has been a member of several international conferences, for instance, the Kyoto Protocol and the Pairs agreement, which were first held in 1997 and 2015 respectively. The aims of these conferences are black and white – to limit the emission of greenhouse gasses and to limit the rise of global temperature.

When there is a problem, there is always a solution. Our country firmly believes that there are ways to combat this issue. Firstly, we think that all countries should burn less fossil fuels, as we think that the high emission of carbon dioxide is not only a key factor but also the symptom of a larger problem. Moving on, high concentrations of carbon dioxide are detrimental to the environment. We should focus on three aspects of the consumption of fossil fuels, with factories being the major one. Secondly, garbage or rubbish should be treated properly. We should stick to the 3Rs in our daily lives. This method can lower the emission of methane, nitrous oxide and carbon dioxide. Thirdly, say NO to deforestation. Actually, trees are silent heroes as they silently protect us from being sunburnt and help us by producing more oxygen. If deforestation is practiced, it will be a double loss as the burning process would release carbon dioxide and there would be fewer trees to absorb CO2. Lastly, we should replace fossil fuels with renewable energy. It is environmentally friendly and there is not a limit on this energy, albeit it may be expensive and time-consuming.

In a nutshell, our country thinks that prevention is better than a cure. We believe that nothing is impossible. As long as we are willing to act, everything can be solved. Cooperation with other countries can also help cope with this issue as this issue must be addressed globally, and not in one particular region.




但我已覺得無所謂了,因為在黑暗裏,有爺爺為我點亮了那盞燈,讓我一點一點我褪去恐懼。
